### Non-Fiction

*The Salt Path* by Raynor Winn

After an almost unimaginable series of misfortunes, Winn and her husband decided to hike the South West Coast Path, England's longest National Trail, and wild camp along the way. Learning how to negotiate life on the trail as they go frees up mental space to assess their lives, and the pair come to terms with the harsh realities they have lately been dealt.

### Fiction

*A Christmas in the Alps* by Melody Carlson

A young woman takes advantage of the chance for a fresh start after discovering ties to a village in the French Alps. Lighthearted romance.

*Moonflower Murders* by Anthony Horowitz

After a young mother goes missing, former book editor Susan Ryeland is drawn back into the world of her star writer, Alan Conway. With a book within the book and plenty of suspects, this traditional English mystery's plot twists will keep you guessing right up to the end.

### Audiobook (available on cloudLibrary)

*Troubled Blood* by Robert Galbraith

Cormoran Strike and Robin Ellacott take on a 40-year-old cold case after being approached by the daughter of a woman who disappeared without a trace one night after leaving her medical practice to meet a friend. The personal stories of Cormoran and Robin are given equal weight to the mystery in this series (written by J.K. Rowling, under a pseudonym), so definitely start from the first and read in order. I always go for the audiobooks with these, as the reader is just phenomenal.
